2021 could potentially be called the most important year for Namikango in the last 10 years. This was the year that each of the following initiatives were launched: Discipleship Training Institute (DTI), opening of the Coffee Roastery and enterprise, the Health Center, and the Albright Football Stadium. In addition to this, we experienced an increase in personnel, both Malawian and American. With 8 new employees, our Namikango staff total rises to 82. Rachel Batter joined our missionary team in 2021 as well, adding another family unit to our existing three. Enjoy these highlights of what God has done through Namikango!

CHURCH LEADERSHIP

Like most other countries, Malawi continued to be affected by Covid throughout 2021. However, despite government restrictions and social distancing measures, Namikango was still able to work with our partnering churches in creative ways. Namikango's Education team was able to travel throughout the country visiting and encouraging churches, holding several small-scale camp meetings, hosting a leadership seminar, and mediating church issues. While the ministry was slowed some due to external circumstances, the mission was still able to encourage and strengthen the body of Christ here in Malawi!

DISCIPLESHIP TRAINING INSTITUTE

After years of planning and construction, the Discipleship Training Institute (DTI) finally started in May 2021. Seventeen students were accepted into the program and lived at the mission for two ten-week terms. These students attended classes in the morning, worked for the mission in the afternoon, and partnered with local churches on the weekends. Classroom instruction was divided into four major themes: spiritual leadership, biblical theology, community development, and personal identity. These themes approach the student holistically, developing them mentally, emotionally, and spiritually. With a strong emphasis on discipleship, students worked in community as they pursued ways to love God and their local communities more.

MATERNITY CLINIC TO HEALTH CENTER

Namikango has been known not only for its church work, but for providing reliable medical service over the last 47 years. In spite of the challenges brought on by Covid, the maternity clinic continued to serve the community, with II20 patients being admitted for delivery, and over 3800 being tested for HIV, among other services. New to our clinic this year was the addition of an outpatient service. Including this as part of our service has given us a status change from Namikango Maternity Clinic to Namikango Health Center. This has opened the door to further serve our community by offering medicines that we were not previously able to, as well as the potential for offering other services in the future.







VILLAGE SAVINGS AND LOANS

The VSL program grew immensely this year because of an increase in demand due to the recognition of its benefits from current groups. In 2021 alone, we trained 50 new VSL groups bringing the total number of participants to 2100+. The total assets amongst these groups are now at \$194,000+. Aside from this growth, we have trained 15 mature groups in group businesses, and each of these groups currently have a business which is generating funds for the group (apart from their own individual businesses). We are grateful for all of the ways in which this program continues to be received well and has reached far more people and areas of Malawi than we could have ever imagined.

WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT

The training of women in our churches and communities continues to be an eagerly received component of Namikango's work. Alongside other facets of our ministry that focus on women (DTI, VSL, and the Health Center), over 1,000 women were trained this year, both spiritually and physically. Paired with a Discovery Bible Study (DBS) and a lesson on discipleship, the women learned how to make firewood conservation stoves, Baobab juice, and jam, plus sweet potato production and soap making. These lessons help families save resources, start small businesses, and give a tool for studying the Bible. The goal is that these women do not only learn, but also train others.

HIV+ PREVENTION & MARRIAGE TRAINING

These seminars integrate the personal and spiritual lives of people, as husbands and wives are educated in how to handle one of Africa's most prominent challenges, HIV/ AIDS, in their own marriages, in the church, and in the community. This year saw 6 major sensitization meetings with influential church & community leaders, 24 seminars,

and 28 follow ups in southern, central, and northern Malawi.





It is hard to imagine that the coffee roastery started only at the end of February 2021. In terms of social reach, publicity and new opportunities, it has far exceeded our goals. One of the major successes of the year was the opportunity to partner with local farmers by buying their green coffee and conducting trainings with them on HIV and conservation agriculture. Even so, there are many aspects of the business that are being tweaked for greater profitability and reach, which will be carried out in the coming year.



FOOTBALL STADIUM

The beginning of the football stadium was met with great excitement. It has started well, both in terms of generating profits, and even more so as an avenue through which to bring the community and Namikango together. Several players from Namikango's team have been targeted by the big leagues in Malawi and will start playing semi-pro in 2022.

We currently see a revenue of about \$490 per month (average). This revenue has only resulted from league games being played on weekends, and we have yet to fully utilize the field through other avenues such as social football, large gatherings, and weddings.

NTONDA PRIMARY SCHOOL



Ntonda Primary School, like all government schools in Malawi, faced challenges with Covid this last year, forcing the school to close down, and then proceed with school for II out of the I2 months. Even so, the school continues to do well and is routinely noted as one of the best schools in its district. In 2021, 25 teachers oversee the 2,070 students enrolled, and 3I graduates from grade 8 were selected for High School, with a pass rate of 93%. In addition, the Bible club averaged I47 students attending per month.
