Village Bible School A New Journey

Papers and pens sat ready on the desks, as 18 former Village Bible School (VBS) leaders in Malawi gathered together for the first time in three years, ready to hear the vision and take the next steps as the program relaunched this March.

Started in the 1980s, the Village Bible School program focused on taking Bible lessons out to the villages. For over 40 years the lessons have reached villages across the nation, empowering many with knowledge of the Bible. As the missionaries experienced the challenges that face communities today, and older leaders passed on their legacies to a new generation, it was clear that it was time for the next step to prepare the church to face new challenges with the power of the gospel.

Modeled after the "journey" groups that the missionaries and the Bible Department have led for the last several years on the main mission campus, **the new VBS groups focus on the heart of discipleship**, with every session focused on reading scripture and digging into the text as a group to talk about and process the practical applications together. "The biggest benefit of the "Journey Groups" has been creating a space where we can discuss and learn together," Ben Hayes says. "We can ask difficult questions that cannot always be asked and discussed in other places. On the journey together, the group members find community with one another as they return to their homes."

While community is an inherent part of Malawian culture, creating an open and inviting spiritual community that centers on the identity that we have in Christ is special and unique. There can be a big gap between passing on information and seeing heart transformation. But once heart transformation begins, there is no going back. Seeing the power that Christ has to realign our hearts puts all other issues into a perspective that allows us to focus back on Jesus.

Many issues of practice rather than doctrine tend to cause division, and Namikango continually strives to have all of its programs return the conversation to Christ and to see his power and presence lived out in every community in which we have the opportunity to work.

Five schools have been launched as a pilot phase to see what will need to be adjusted for the future of village discipleship through Namikango and the Church of Christ in Malawi, with great potential for rapid multiplication. Namikango also has a large presence of Village Bible Schools in nearby Mozambique, which has continued on throughout the last three years even as the Malawi schools paused. They have remained faithful and steadfast despite the challenge that distance and locality presents. The pilot phase of the program in Malawi will provide good information and experience to see how the model can be replicated to reach other areas with the transformative power of the gospel.
