WELCOME



Moni nonse! Greetings everyone!

If 2023 was a milestone in Namikango's history, 2024 has been truly monumental. The appointment of Bisani Mphongolo as Namikango's first Malawian Mission Director, alongside the active leadership of the Malawi Board of Directors, marks a significant step forward. With over 80 staff members and II ministries, this is no small task. Yet, this transition is essential because leadership—and the training of leaders—is at the very heart of Namikango's mission.

Even as these leadership shifts took place, new leaders were being formed across Malawi. Sixteen individuals are currently being equipped through the Discipleship Training Institute (DTI), gaining tools to foster Christ-centered community transformation by breaking cycles of poverty and strengthening the church. Among them, **Winston and Victoria recently helped mediate a dispute in their home congregation, bringing peace and unity.**

Beyond the church, transformation is happening in the village as well. Women in Namikango's Women's Development program harvested approximately 6,000 pounds of orange sweet potatoes—a crop they learned to cultivate—which provided critical sustenance during the drought of 2024.

Meanwhile, our Church Partnerships initiative brought congregations together for training and mutual support. As a result, the **Nasato church launched a goat husbandry project**, where members pass a goat to others in the congregation, multiplying resources. So far, 24 members now own goats, creating a sustainable impact.

Additionally, the Mtendere Village Savings and Loans group saw remarkable growth, **sharing out \$14,000 this year—2.5 times the amount they started with five years ago!**

These stories are just a glimpse of the transformation taking place. Lives have been changed, and people have come to know Jesus more deeply.

And through it all, one of the most profound things we have witnessed is the strengthening of the deep, abiding connection between Malawi and the U.S.

Your partnership has created the possibility for the transformation above!

Church Leadership

Namikango provides support and leadership training to more than 2,000 congregations. Relationships with these congregations form the foundation of the ministry, serving as the primary channels for spreading the good news of Jesus and addressing people's physical, spiritual, social, and emotional needs. This work involves ongoing communication, regular visits, and annual training. Thanks to the support and partnership of people like YOU, 433 congregations received training or visitation in 2024, impacting more than 5,417 people through the Church Partnerships initiative.



Discipleship Training Institute

While each of the other ministry initiatives impacts thousands, the Discipleship Training Institute (DTI) is Namikango's primary approach to multiplication. **The 16 students in DTI Cohort 2**—six couples and four individuals—are being equipped with a comprehensive set of skills and tools, including biblical knowledge, Village Savings and Loans methodology, HIV care and support training, and more. In just one year, they will return to their homes and churches, ready to disciple and equip others with these same tools.



Women's Development

Uplifting and empowering women was a central part of Jesus' ministry, and it remains a key focus of Namikango's work. In 2024, more than 4,288 women from over 170 congregations received training in various capacities. Business training provided a lifeline for many families during a nationwide drought, offering crucial support when options were minimal. And, most importantly, **4,288 women came to know Jesus** a little more than they had before.



Village Savings and Loan

The Village Savings and Loans (VSL) initiative is one of Namikango's most autonomous and selfsustaining programs. To date, over 100 groups have been trained and empowered to operate independently. In 2024, 19 new groups began saving money, accessing loans, and launching businesses.



Ntonda Primary School

Enrollment at Ntonda continues to grow steadily each year, **increasing from 2,106 in 2023 to 2,238 in 2024**. In addition to receiving biblical instruction during school, students have the opportunity to deepen their faith through the after-school Bible Club, which remains strong with an average monthly attendance of over 200. On a larger scale, Ntonda was recognized as an outstanding performer, with 37 students moving on to High School, and two graduates earning placement at a National Day High School—the highest level students can reach at this age!



Health Care

The Health Center is a pillar in the Thondwe community. With over 1,000 admissions to the Maternity clinic this year, and 16,000 people receiving treatments of various kinds – HIV, Antenatal, Outpatient, and others – the Center continues to meet a crucial need in this region.



Soccer

The Namikango Lions F.C. had another outstanding year—so much so that they have **qualified for the Premier League** (semiprofessional level)! This is a major milestone, creating new opportunities for players to advance in their careers. Beyond football, this achievement expands opportunities for community engagement and further establishes Namikango's presence throughout Malawi. Namikango F.C. continues to serve as a conduit for reaching young men, providing a Christcentered environment where they can grow and mature.




Our plantation produced 3,370 kgs of coffee this year. While the roastery and business were not in operation during 2024, connections were made with potential farmers to supply coffee in 2025, and a business plan was developed. The vision is to relaunch coffee in 2025!



Permaculture — Conservation Agriculture

Eighty percent of Malawians are subsistence farmers. The Conservation Agriculture and Permaculture initiatives equip local farmers with training to maximize yields using available resources. As deforestation remains a critical issue in Malawi, beekeeping training has been introduced over the past two years as a sustainable solution. Currently, **10 groups are engaged in the Namikango Environmental Conservation for Income Generation project, with the first honey harvest expected in 2025**!


